On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to welcome you to Hawaii's first-ever Flute Week and to the inaugural public events of the Hawaii Flute Society!



Susan McGinn, originally from Detroit, studied nearby at the University of Michigan before attending graduate school as a teaching assistant at the University of Illinois and Indiana University. Her first orchestral job was with the Canton, OH Symphony and in 1990 she joined the Honolulu Symphony and Chamber Music Hawaii. She has performed around the world with ensembles such as Grupo Musica Antiqua (Italy) and Orchestra dell'opera di Mascagni (Italy), and at festivals including Schleswig Holstein (Germany), Peter Brit (OR), Skaneateles (NY), Crested Butte (CO), the National Repertory Orchestra, National Orchestral Institute and the LA Phil Institute. Her major teachers were James Pellerite, Clem Barone, Richard Graef, Julius Baker and Peter Lloyd. She has additionally studied Alexander Technique, voice, dance, breathing with Arnold Jacobs, practice techniques with Burton Kaplan and flute with Keith Underwood.
