Did you know...?

Widely regarded as the “dean of American composers,” Aaron Copland is well-known for his symphonies and ballets such as “Appalachian Spring” and “Rodeo.”  John Philip Sousa’s “The Stars and Stripes Forever” officially became the National March of the USA by an Act of Congress in 1987.  2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the composition of the Griffes *Poem*, which has since become a flute repertoire staple. It was premiered in 1919 by Georges Barrère.  When flutist/composer Katherine Hoover enrolled in the Eastman School of Music in 1957, its director was composer Howard Hanson.
