She has previously held one-year positions as Piccolo/3<sup>rd</sup> Flute with the Honolulu Symphony Orchestra and the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Richter was also the Director of Flute Choirs at the Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra for several years, and continues to be involved in directing flute choirs here in Hawaii with the Hawaii Flute Society.
